HUMAN DIMENSIONS OF THE ATMOSPHERE. By the *Task Group on Human Dimensions of the Atmosphere* (National Science Foundation). Washington, D.C.: U.S. Government Printing Office, 1968. Pp. vi, 174. \$1.50.

This follow-up to the National Science Foundation's Special Commission on Weather Modification examines the scientific, social, legal and political implications of weather modification and climate control.

1969 U.S. MASTER TAX GUIDE. Chicago: Commerce Clearing House, Inc., 1968. Pp. 560. \$5.00.

Designed primarily as a reference for the preparation of tax returns, this guide offers the layman or attorney a concise source of up-to-date tax law and provides, through numerous examples, a clear picture of the law's application.

WOMEN AND THE LAW. By *Leo Kanowitz*. Albuquerque, N.M.: The University of New Mexico Press, 1969. Pp. ix, 312. \$8.95.

Raising the constitutional questions of due process and equal protection, Professor Kanowitz analytically examines the sex-based legal inequalities of American women. In the context of both civil and criminal law, the author details the unequal treatment accorded women, paying particular attention to the impact of recent federal legislation on equal employment opportunities for women.
